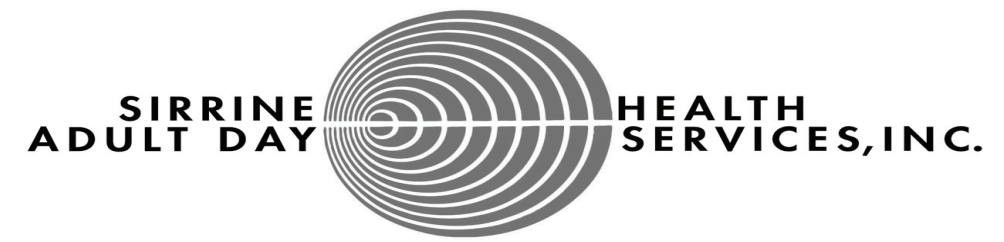

She was also the first woman mail carrier for the Post Office there.

She loves being outdoors and watching the sunsets. She enjoys going to SIRRINE and her good humor and friendliness is appreciated by everyone.

The HoHoKams of Mesa is a very successful volunteer organization that has been around for over 60 years. Although rich in history, it is an organization that is not known by many in the community. 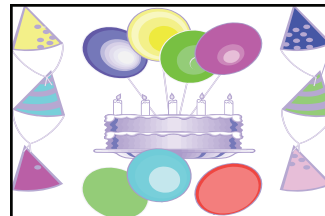
